Paletton is an online application located on the internet at Paletton.com. It provides powerful tool to create [color combinations](#) and palettes of colors that work together well. The major advantage of Paletton is it's not using the modern computer and engineering [RGB color space](#), but it's built on a classical artistic [color wheel](#), applies classical [color theory](#) and works within a specially created [RYB color space](#). Therefore the [color combinations](#) it produces are very different from those you can get in many computer graphic applications.
